Worship Service Resumes

Welcome Back!!! Even though it will look a little different we are back to in house worship services. We will be following the guidelines set forth by the Louisiana Conference of the United Methodist Council and the CDC. During Phase 1 we are allowed 25% building occupancy to gather.

Our worship services will be at 9:00am for people with the last names ending in the letter A through L. and the 11:00am for people with the last names ending in the letter M through Z. Please adhere to these listing times.

We will be taking attendance before you enter the building, taking your temperature and asking you 4 important questions:

1. Have you been diagnosed with the COVID 19 Virus?
2. Has anyone in your household or close contact been diagnosed with the COVID 19 virus?
3. Do you have a cough?
4. Do you have or have you had a fever in the last 24 hours?

If the answer to any of the above questions is YES, you should NOT attend in-house worship.

Everyone entering the building are going to be required to wear a mask. If you do not have one on you we will provide one to you. We will be practicing safe distancing and we will not have a Passing the Peace time during worship. We are also asking that there is only 1 (one) person in the restroom at a time and there will be a monitor at the door to be able to disinfect after each use. We will have hand sanitizer available for your use.

We do ask that you keep your distance and keep your hands to yourself. Please do not touch items that you do not need to.
